Township

Park And Recreational Millage Proposal

Shall the tax limitation on all taxable property within the Township of New Buffalo, Berrien County, Michigan, be increased and the Township be authorized to levy annually an amount not to exceed .37 mill (\$0.37 on each \$1,000 of taxable value), of which .2311 mill is a renewal of a previously authorized millage that expired in 2021 and .1389 mill is a new additional millage, for ten (10) years, 2022 to 2031 inclusive, to provide funds for all park and recreational uses permitted by law, including but not limited to maintaining, improving, purchasing, constructing or acquiring property, property interests, trails, pathways and facilities for park and recreational purposes? The estimate of the revenue the Township will collect if the millage is approved and levied in the 2022 calendar year (the first year of levy) is approximately \$244,000. A portion of the revenue collected will be required to be distributed to the New Buffalo Township Corridor Improvement Authority.
