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### 6. Knox Boxes

We recommend looking into buying a Knox box, Knox padlock, Knox key switch, or other Knox device. It shall be installed per the Fire Code. Flush Knox boxes are recommended for security reasons. The fire inspector shall secure the keys in the Knox box. A Knox box will allow the fire department access into a structure during an emergency avoiding additional damage to property. Please contact the fire department for further information.

### 7. License Requirements

No person may commence or continue a business within the Township without having first obtained a Township license, therefore as hereinafter provided and without maintaining such licensing in current effect during any business operation or activity.

### 8. Purpose

This ordinance shall provide for the annual registration of all businesses with the Township. Information shall be collected for the following purposes:

- 1. Provide more adequate police and fire protection
- 2. Provide more equal and equitable real and personal property taxation
- 3. Planning for public utility services within the Township
- 4. More comprehensive and informed planning and zoning for uses of land and structures within the Township
- 5. Establish a registry of businesses operating within the Township for the general information of the public, and for the promotion of the Township

### 9. Fundamental Requirements and Minimum Inspection Frequency

NFPA 1 Fire Code 2018 edition is applicable to both new and existing occupancies. Per Section 10.1.1, every new and existing building or structure shall be constructed, arranged, equipped, maintained, and operated in accordance with this Code so as to provide a reasonable level of life safety, property protection, and public welfare from the actual and potential hazards created by fire, explosion, and other hazardous conditions.

Code plays a role in a building during both construction of the building as well as maintenance throughout the life of the building. The enforcement of a building does not stop once its construction is complete and a certificate of occupancy is received. Section 10.2.7 which prescribes the minimum fire prevention inspection frequencies for existing occupancies. The provisions of 10.2.7 shall not apply to detached one- and two-family dwellings or townhomes.

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### 10. Approval Conditions

All enforcement will be by the "New Buffalo Township UNIFORM FIRE CODE Ordinance". Please review the **CONTRACTORS AND BUSINESS FIRE INSPECTION GUIDE**. This guide provides important inspection and testing information and Certificate of Occupancy requirements that will assist the Fire Inspector in completing an inspection and assisting you with finishing your project.

Our goal is to achieve compliance with the Fire Code by partnering and assisting you with the completion of you project within your deadlines. In order to be successful in this endeavor, communication is critical. If you communicate your issues to the fire inspector, an early solution can generally be worked out that will satisfy everyone.

#### 11. VIOLATIONS:

Any person, firm, association, partnership, corporation, or governmental entity who violates any of the provisions of this Ordinance or the Uniform Fire Code adopted hereunder shall be deemed to be responsible for a municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan Statute, which shall be punishable by civil fine determined in accordance with the following schedule:

Additionally, the violator shall pay costs which may include all expenses, direct and indirect, to which the Township of New Buffalo has incurred in connection with the municipal civil infraction. In no case, however, shall costs of less than \$20.00 nor more than \$500.00 be ordered. In addition, the Township of New Buffalo shall have the right to proceed in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of obtaining an injunction, restraining order, or other appropriate remedy to compel compliance with this

#### 12. Penalty Clause

Any violation of this ordinance, or any part thereof, shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 plus court costs and/or confinement in the County Jail for a term not to exceed 90 days. In addition, the Township specifically reserves the right to proceed in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of obtaining an injunction, restraining order or other appropriate remedy to compel compliance with this ordinance.
