

SUMMARY OF UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE ORDINANCE
New Buffalo Township
UNIFORM TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

The following is a summary of the New Buffalo Township Uniform Traffic Code Ordinance adopted by the New Buffalo Township Board of Trustees at its regular meeting on May 19, 2014. This ordinance provides for the enforcement of traffic laws including parts of the Michigan Vehicle Code and parts of the Uniform Traffic Code as designated pursuant to the terms of MCL 41.181 and 257.951, and 257.955. A true copy of the entire ordinance may be inspected or obtained at the New Buffalo Township Hall, 17425 Red Arrow Highway, New Buffalo, MI 49117, during regular business hours.

THE TOWNSHIP OF NEW BUFFALO, BERRIEN COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Title

This Ordinance may be cited and shall be known as the "New Buffalo Township Traffic Code Ordinance".

SECTION 2. Adoption of Uniform Traffic Code By Reference

The Uniform Traffic Code is adopted by reference.

SECTION 3. Adoption of Provisions of Michigan Vehicle Code By Reference

Numerous sections of the Michigan Vehicle Code are adopted by reference.

SECTION 4. Adoption of Other State Laws By Reference

The Michigan Insurance Code pertaining to required insurance is adopted by reference.

SECTION 5. Penalties

The penalties provided in both the Uniform Traffic Code and other state statutes are adopted by reference.

SECTION 6. Severability

The various parts, sections and clauses of this ordinance are declared severable and if a court determines a penalty provision to exceed the authority of the Township, the penalty shall be construed as the maximum penalty that is determined by the court to be within the authority of the Township.

SECTION 7. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions and Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after its adoption and publication. Upon its effective date, this Ordinance supercedes and repeals prior conflicting or inconsistent ordinances or parts thereof

SECTION 8. Effective Date; Publication

The Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after publication of this summary in a newspaper circulated in the Township.
